AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE A NEW ARTICLE VI OF CHAPTER 42
OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO INCLUDE REGULATIONS
PERTAINING TO PROHIBITED PARKING WITHIN
THE CITY OF NORTON SHORES

Ordinance No. 722

THE CITY OF NORTON SHORES HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1: Purpose. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Norton Shores, certain regulations regarding the parking of mobile homes, travel homes, boats, boat trailers, personal watercraft, personal watercraft trailers, snowmobile trailers and other recreational vehicles are necessary to ensure that the right of ways are clear and passable, and that there are no obstructions to vision necessary for traffic safety.

Section 2: That a new Article VI, "Prohibited Parking," be added to Chapter 42 of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Norton Shores to read as follows:

Section 42-185. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning.

Recreational vehicle means a vehicle designed or constructed for recreational purposes, and which may permit occupancy thereof as a dwelling or sleeping place such as, but not limited to, motor homes, campers, camper trailers, off-road vehicles, boats and utility trailers.

Right of way means all of that portion of the property described, dedicated or created by use by the public for rights-of-way, or installation and maintenance of public utilities.

Section 42-186. Prohibited Parking.

- A. In zoning districts R1, R2, R3, R4, and CR6 no mobile home, travel home, boat, boat trailer, personal watercraft, personal watercraft trailer, snowmobile trailer or other recreational vehicle, referred to collectively in this Article only as "recreational equipment," shall be stored or parked within a public right of way.

B. Commercial trucks and trailers shall not be parked or stored in the public right of way in zoning districts R1, R2, R3, R4 and CR6.

Section 3. Severability. Should any part of this ordinance be held invalid by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction, the remaining parts shall be severable and shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Ordinance Repeal. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective upon adoption and publication.
