### **RESOLUTION NUMBER 84-2016**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA INCREASING WATER AND SEWER CUSTOMER DEPOSITS AND ADOPTING A SCHEDULE OF FEES, CHARGES AND DEPOSITS FOR WATER, WASTEWATER, SANITATION, STORMWATER SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE WATER, WASTEWATER, AND SANITATION RATE STUDY, DATED AUGUST, 29, 2012, AND THE FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION PRICE INDEX PUBLISHED DECEMBER 15, 2015, UNDER CHAPTER 34 FOR SANITATION AND CHAPTER 42 FOR UTILITIES, OF THE CITY CODE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

\* \* \* \* \*

WHEREAS, pursuant to various provisions of the City Code, the City Commission has determined that certain fess, charges and deposits should be implemented for the payments involved with the collection of solid waste, and the provision of utilities services.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA that:

SECTION 1: The fees, charges and deposit schedules in the Water, Wastewater, and Sanitation Rate Study dated August 29, 2012 and the Florida Public Service Commission Price Index published on December 15, 2015, attached hereto as Exhibit "A," are hereby adopted for use by the City in conjunction with the provision of solid waste collection and utilities services by the City.

SECTION 2: The fees and charges for Stormwater are hereby adopted in accordance with the Florida Public Service Commission Price Index published on December 15, 2015.

<u>SECTION 3:</u> The City Commission retains jurisdiction over the rate schedule and any administrative costs, which may be later amended from time to time, by Resolution.

<u>SECTION 4:</u> This resolution shall take effect October 1, 2016.

- 34-5 Solid waste collection charges.
- (1) Residential:

Single-family, duplex and triplex buildings

\$ <del>16.78</del> <u>17.00</u> for each dwelling unit

Commercial rate

Multifamily (four or more units)

Residential buildings using a dumpster shall be billed as a commercial consumer. Where vehicle access is not available, carts shall be used and the consumer shall be billed as a commercial consumer.

(2) Commercial (all nonresidential uses): The fee for all nonresidential uses shall be \$ 9.22 9.34 per weekly picked up multiplied by cubic yard of garbage as set forth in the following schedule:

Unless otherwise determined by the city public works director, the cubic yardage of garbage shall be the cubic yardage of the container used.

- (3) *Home occupational businesses:* Home occupational businesses using 90-gallon containers shall be charged the residential rate plus an additional rate not to exceed \$ 39.9740.49 per container based on the volume of waste generated by each home business as determined by the supervisor.
- (4) Commercial roll-off/compactor: The fees for all commercial roll-off/compactor services shall be calculated based on the actual tipping fee and pull rate as set forth in the following schedule:

- (5) Voluntary commercial recycling: Commercial consumers may elect to participate in a voluntary recycling program. The voluntary program will be established through solid waste audits. Commercial consumers must adhere to the audited findings and will not be eligible for a reduced commercial rate should future audits determine the commercial consumer has failed to recycle materials identified in the audit.
- (6) Commercial recycling: The fee for all commercial uses shall be \$ 4.614.67 per weekly pickup multiplied by cubic yard of recycling materials as set forth in the following schedule:

- (15) Commercial trash pickup minimum fee: The minimum fee for any commercial trash pickup regardless of size shall be no less than a one-fourth load.
- (16) Yard trash generated by landscaping business: In addition to the fee based on load size there shall be an additional \$65.00 fee for removal of yard trash generated by any landscaping business.

- (17) Residential deposits: Residential consumers shall pay a \$50.00 deposit to the city upon commencement of a new or re-established containerized service. This deposit shall be returned to the payer upon termination of the solid waste removal service by the city, the payment of all charges due, and return of the container in good and sanitary condition.
- (18) Commercial and multifamily deposits: Commercial and multi-family consumers shall pay a deposit equal to three months estimated service charge upon the commencement of new or re-established service. This deposit shall be returned to the payer upon (i) termination of the solid waste removal service by the city; and (ii) the payment of all outstanding amounts due to the city for any and all goods and services, taxes or assessments; and (iii) the return of the container in good and sanitary condition. In the event that a consumer has an outstanding balance to the city for any goods and services, taxes or assessments, the consumer deposit shall be applied to the extent of the amount owed
- (19) Roll-off container deposits: Commercial roll-off container consumers shall pay a deposit of \$500.00 upon the commencement of new or re-established service. The deposit will be waived for all existing accounts in good standing. This deposit shall be returned to the payer upon (i) termination of the solid waste removal service by the city; and (ii) the payment of all outstanding amounts due to the city for any and all goods and services, taxes or assessments; and (iii) the return of the container in good and sanitary condition. In the event that a consumer has an outstanding balance to the city for any goods and services, taxes or assessments, the consumer deposit shall be applied to the extent of the amount owed.
- (20) Roll-off compactor deposits: Commercial and multifamily consumers shall pay a deposit of \$1,000.00 upon the commencement of new or re-established service. This deposit shall be returned to the payer upon (i) termination of the solid waste removal service by the city; and (ii) the payment of all outstanding amounts due to the city for any and all goods and services, taxes or assessments; and (iii) the return of the container in good and sanitary condition. In the event that a consumer has an outstanding balance to the city for any goods and services, taxes or assessments, the consumer deposit shall be applied to the extent of the amount owed.
- (21) Accounting charge: There shall be a charge of \$34.00 to establish an account for sanitation service only. After disconnection, a sanitation service shall not again be established without payment of all outstanding sanitation service charges and fees due the city.
- (22) No partial service: As a condition of service provided by the city, a consumer may not request to discontinue sanitation service without requesting all services provided by the city be discontinued.
- (23) New container service fee: A new container service fee of \$15.00 shall be charged for the delivery of a new or different dumpster requested by the consumer. A fee of \$75.00 shall be charged for the installation of casters on dumpsters.
- (24) Roll-off/compactor service fee: A new roll-off/compactor service fee of \$100.00 shall be charged for the delivery of a new roll-off/compactor.

- (25) Delinquent account service charge: A bill shall be deemed delinquent if not paid within 30 days of mailing. After 30 days of the date of mailing, the city shall charge 1.5 percent interest monthly or fraction thereof on the amount of a delinquent balance of \$15.00 or more of charges due the city for the service.
- (26) Key-operated dumpster charge: There shall be a charge of \$56.00 for installation by the city of a locking device for a key-operated dumpster.
- (27) Inaccessible dumpster or roll-off/compactor: There shall be a charge of \$15.00 for each return trip necessitated by an inaccessible dumpster and a charge of \$135.00 for each return trip necessitated by an inaccessible roll off/compactor.
- (28) Change in billing charge: There shall be a charge of \$34.00 per unit for any change in service requested by the consumer which requires a corresponding change in the manner or amount of billing by the city.
- (29) Dumpster cleaning by city charge: In the event the consumer fails to clean an unsanitary dumpster or roll-off/compactor after five days' notice to do so by the city, the city shall clean the dumpster and shall charge the consumer a fee of \$75.00, and \$100.00 for roll-off/compactors..
- (30) *Relocation charge:* In the event the consumer requests a relocation of a roll-off/compactor the city shall charge the consumer \$75.00 per occurrence.
- (31) Loss of container: The consumer is solely responsible and liable for the loss of any roll-off, compactor, dumpster, or cart provided by the city, regardless of cause, including theft, damage, and vandalism. The city shall charge the consumer the actual cost of repair and/or replacement.

- (3) Deposit Waiver. A residential applicant may be eligible for a deposit waiver if the property owner has established a satisfactory payment record of all city utility charges for the preceding 23 months within 20 days of mailing. Utility service deposits for residential tenants and commercial consumers will not be refunded until the water and sewer services are terminated.

### (10) Construction Water Accounts

All potable water used for construction purposes or any other approved purpose on a project must pass through a meter with an approved backflow prevention device.

Residential construction water accounts will be established after an account has been established. Whenever possible a residential construction meter will be installed in the location of the permanent location.

Commercial construction water accounts will be established after an account has been established. Construction water may be provided through an existing fire hydrant that is located in the public right of way within the limits of construction. The City will install construction meters on specific hydrants and the Customer will be billed for all appropriate fees. The installed meter shall not remain in service at any one location for more than one (1) year.

<u>Construction meters may only be moved by City personnel. "Construction water" may be used for non-potable applications such as temporary irrigation, testing of internal plumbing systems, flushing toilets in model homes, construction and/or sales trailers.</u>

- (103) Accounting charge: There shall be a charge of \$34.00 to establish an account for water service.
- (144) Disconnection charge: There shall be a charge of \$34.00 to reestablish any water service that has been disconnected for nonpayment. After disconnection, a water meter shall not be again connected without payment of all outstanding utility related charges, fees and/or additional deposits due the city.
- (125) Same day service charge: There shall be a charge of \$34.00 to perform any same day utility related service call that occurs after 2:00 p.m. of the same day the request was issued by the customer.
- (136) Meter rereads and leak inspection charge: There shall be a service charge of \$15.00 for a special inspection for a meter reread or for a leak inspection requested by a consumer. A reread of a meter due an error in the initial meter reading shall be performed by the city without charge. A leak inspection charge shall not be charged if a leak is found in city-maintained facilities.
- (147) Delinquent utility service account charge: A bill shall be deemed delinquent if not paid within 30 days of mailing. After 30 days of the date of mailing, the city shall charge to such account 1.5 percent interest monthly on each delinquent balance of charges due the city for water and sewer service on the amount of a delinquent balance of \$15.00 or more.

- (158) Service call charge: Except as otherwise provided herein, when the city is requested by a consumer to respond to a problem not caused by the city, the city shall charge the consumer for all necessary labor, materials and indirect costs to respond actually incurred by the city.
- (169) Collection fee: In the event the city sends a delinquent account to a collection agency for collection, a collection fee of \$10.00 shall be added to the account.
- (4720) Meter calibration test: At the request of a consumer, the city will test a water meter to determine if it is operating accurately within an allowable tolerance of plus or minus two percent of actual flow. In the event a consumer has been overcharged due to a faulty meter, the previous six bills shall be examined and adjusted accordingly. For a meter determined to be within allowable tolerance, the following meter test charges shall apply:

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3/4"—2" meter ...$25.00
3"—8" meter ...$50.00
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- (4821) Damage repair: Damage caused by the failure of a consumer to properly locate and isolate water and sewer facilities shall be repaired by the city and charged to the consumer.
- (1922) Annual rate adjustment: The city manager may adjust the monthly base charge and monthly volume charge for water service, and the monthly base charge and monthly volume charge for sewer service, to reflect changes in operating costs without further action by the city commission. Prior to implementation thereof, notice of such rate adjustments shall be promptly provided by the city manager to the city commission. The city manager shall utilize the "price increase or decrease index" for major categories of utility operating costs which is annually adopted by the Florida Public Service Commission as required by F.S. § 367.081(4)(a). The rate adjustment shall be based upon the application of the indices within the index to the amount of the major categories of operating costs incurred by the city in providing the water service and sewer service during the immediately preceding calendar year.
- 42-169 Stormwater system user fees four dollars seventwelve cents (\$ 4.0712) per equivalent residential unit per month.

The city manager may adjust the stormwater management system user fee, to reflect changes in operating costs without further action by the city commission. Prior to implementation thereof, notice of such rate adjustments shall be promptly provided by the city manager to the city commission. The city manager shall utilize the "price increase or decrease index" for major categories of utility operating costs which is annually adopted by the Florida Public Service Commission as required by F.S. § 367.081(4)(a). The rate adjustment shall be based upon the application of the indices within the index to the amount of the major categories of operating costs incurred by the city in providing the stormwater service during the immediately preceding calendar year.
