Ordinance No. 320-A

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FLAT
ROCK BY AMENDING SECTION 62-6 ENTITLED PROHIBITED
ACTIVITIES OF ARTICLE I OF CHAPTER 62 DESIGNATING
PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES WITHIN CITY PARKS.**

THE CITY OF FLAT ROCK ORDAINS:

SECTION I. Section 62-6 entitled "Prohibited Activities" of Article I of Chapter 62 of the Code of the City of Flat Rock is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 62-6. Prohibited activities.

No person in a park shall:

- (1) *Intoxicating beverages.* Have brought alcoholic beverages, nor shall any person drink alcoholic beverages at any time in the park, unless authorized by permit specifically granted by the director after approval from the city council.
- (2) *Drunkenness.* Have entered or be under the influence of intoxicating liquor.
- (3) *Fireworks and explosives.* Have brought, or have in his possession, or set off or otherwise cause to explode or discharge or burn any firecrackers, torpedo, rocket or other fireworks or explosives of inflammable material, or discharge them or throw them into any area from land or highway adjacent thereto. This prohibition includes any substance, compound, mixture or article that, in conjunction with any substance or compound, would be dangerous from any of the foregoing standpoints.
- (4) *Domestic animals.* Have been responsible for the entry of a dog or other domestic animal into areas other than automobile parking concourses and walks immediately adjacent thereto. Nothing herein shall be construed as permitting the running of dogs or other pets at large. All dogs or other pets in those areas where such animals are

permitted shall be restrained at all times on adequate leashes, no more than six feet in length.


- (5) *Fires.* Build or attempt to build an open fire. No person shall drop, throw or otherwise scatter lighted matches, burning cigarettes or cigars, tobacco paper or other inflammable material within any park area or on any highway, road or street abutting or contiguous thereto.
- (6) *Closed areas.* Enter an area posted as "Closed to the Public," nor shall any person use or abet the use of any area in violation of posted notices.
- (7) *Going onto ice.* Go onto the ice on any waters except such areas as are designated as skating rinks.
- (8) *Loitering and boisterousness.* Sleep or protractedly lounge on the seats or benches or other areas, or engage in loud, boisterous, threatening, abusive, insulting or indecent language, or engage in any disorderly conduct or behavior tending to a breach of the public peace.
- (9) *Exhibit permits.* Fail to produce and exhibit any permit upon request of any authorized person who shall desire to inspect the same for the purpose of enforcing compliance with any ordinance or rule.
- (10) *Interference with permittees.* Disturb or interfere unreasonably with any person or party occupying any area, or participating in any activity, under the authority of a permit.
- (11) *Fishing regulations.*
 - (a) Take, catch, or kill or attempt to take, catch, or kill any species of fish except during open seasons designated for that species of fish by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.
 - (b) Take or possess any species of fish of a length less than the permissible length as established by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources. Fish of not permissible length must be returned to the water immediately.
 - (c) Possess more than daily possession limit or aggregate daily possession limit, as applicable, of fish at the place the fish were taken as established by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.
 - (d) Possess any fish that is so mutilated that the identification or measurement of that fish is impossible.

- (e) To pursue, capture, catch, kill or take fish or attempting to pursue, capture, catch, kill or take fish without having in his or her possession a valid fishing license issued under the authority of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources. This subsection shall not apply to persons under the age of 18 years, or during free fishing days as designated by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.
- (f) Taking a fish by hook and fishing line unless hooked in the mouth. Fish not hooked in the mouth must be returned to the water immediately.
- (g) Fish anywhere in a fish ladder.
- (h) Fish using a weight rigidly attached to a multi-pointed hook, or suspended from a multi-point hook.

SECTION II. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances, Code of the City of Flat Rock, or parts of the Code of the City of Flat Rock, not consistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION III. The invalidity of any clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this ordinance.

SECTION IV. This ordinance shall be published in the News Herald newspaper as required by Charter on the 13 day of April, 2012, but in no event shall be effective earlier than ten (10) days after enactment.
