ORDINANCE NO. 2013-07

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
OF PUTNAM COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 34-1 OF
ARTICLE I OF CHAPTER 34 OF THE PUTNAM COUNTY CODE
RELATING TO SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND ESTABLISHING
AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desires to further specify the types of properties that are subject to the annual solid waste assessment;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS OF PUTNAM COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

Section 1. The definition of “residential collection service” set forth at Section 34-1 of Article I of Chapter 34 of the Putnam County Code is hereby amended to read in its entirety as set forth in Appendix A attached hereto.

Section 2. Section 34-41(a) of Article II of Chapter 34 of the Putnam County Code is hereby amended to read in its entirety as set forth in Appendix B attached hereto.

Section 3. The provisions hereof shall supersede any provisions covering the same subject previously adopted by the County Commission.

Section 4. A certified copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Department of State by the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners and shall take effect upon receipt of official acknowledgement from the Department of State that this Ordinance has been filed.

APPENDIX A

Section 34-1. Definitions.

Residential collection service means service to residential dwelling units which shall include single-family dwellings, mobile homes not located in mobile home parks, multi-family dwellings of nine dwelling units or less under common ownership, and all other properties which are deemed by the county property appraiser as being assessable for solid waste purposes. The county property appraiser will provide the number of assessable units located on each applicable parcel in the county in a "solid waste" field in the appraiser's computer system. For the purpose of this chapter, condominiums shall be considered as part of commercial collection service and treated as multi-family dwellings of ten or more dwelling units.

APPENDIX B

Section 34-41. Scope of special assessment; delinquency; liens.

(a) The annual solid waste collection and disposal special assessments shall be imposed against the owners of all residential units as defined in Section 34-1 which are deemed by the county property appraiser as being assessable for solid waste purposes on the January 1 prior to the fiscal year in which the annual collection special assessment is imposed, regardless of whether such property is occupied on said date. The owner and description of each residential unit shall be that designated on the real property assessment roll maintained by the county property appraiser even though the property appraiser's assessment roll may not be current with regard to ownership.
