

ORDINANCE #G-1-12

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING FEES, RATES AND CHARGES FOR THE CITY OF PORT LAVACA, TEXAS; FOR ADMINISTRATION; ALARM SYSTEMS; AMUSEMENT AND ENTERTAINMENT; ANIMAL CONTROL; BUILDING REGULATIONS, PERMITTING, INSPECTIONS, LICENSING, CONTRACTORS; SUBDIVISIONS AND PLATS; ENVIRONMENT AND HEALTH; FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION; HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INCIDENT MITIGATION; MANUFACTURED HOUSING; PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS, ITINERANT VENDORS AND GARAGE SALES; TELECOMMUNICATIONS; TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES FOR HIRE; WATERWAYS; BAUER COMMUNITY CENTER; WATER AND SEWER RATES; WATER AND SEWER TAPS; UTILITY CUSTOMER SERVICE; PARKS AND RECREATION; LIGHTHOUSE BEACH AND RV PARK; PROVIDING FOR A CUMULATIVE PROVISION, REPEALING CLAUSE, AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

ARTICLE I GENERAL

WHEREAS, the City of Port Lavaca provides services for Water and Sewer, Utility Customer Service, Building Permitting and Inspections, Lighthouse Beach and RV Park, and Animal Control. The council finds it necessary, from time to time, to increase fees for services. The following charges are enacted and may from time to time be changed as required.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT LAVACA, TEXAS:

ARTICLE II FEES

SEE APPENDIX 'A' (CITY OF PORT LAVACA FEES, RATES AND CHARGES)

ARTICLE III

CUMULATIVE PROVISION

The provisions of this Ordinance as set out above shall be deemed cumulative of the provisions and regulations in the ordinances heretofore enacted by the City Council of the City of Port Lavaca, Texas and the general laws of the State of Texas, save and except where the provisions of this Ordinance and any other Ordinance heretofore enacted are in conflict, then the provisions contained in this Ordinance shall prevail.

ARTICLE IV

SEVERANCE AND UNCONSTITUTIONALITY

It is specifically declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are severable, and if phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid by the valid judgment or decree of any Court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any unconstitutional or invalid phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections.

ARTICLE V - REPEALING CLAUSE:

All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the City of Port Lavaca in conflict herewith, in particular Ordinance No. G-3-08, are hereby repealed.

ARTICLE VI- EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect on April 01, 2012 after its adoption and enactment by the City Council and publication as required by the Texas Local Government Code.

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Note— Average usage rate: Wastewater user rates shall be computed by averaging the water usage of the customer for the months of December, January and February. The average usage rate computed during these months shall apply notwithstanding any change in residence. During March of each year, the wastewater user rates shall be recomputed for each residential customer.

Note— New residences: New residences or residences which have no water usage history, shall be charged based upon actual usage at a rate of \$14.00 for the first 2,000 gallons and \$4.90 per thousand in excess of 2,000 gallons until an average can be computed based upon the formula in subsection (a) of this section.

Note— Variations: The director of finance or his designee is authorized to establish a wastewater user rate for a newly constructed residence or a residence with a change in occupancy or to make necessary adjustments in the event of a water leak upon request by the customer.

Note—The director of finance or his designee is also authorized to modify an individual's rate if application of the winter average would result in an unusual burden on the customer because their usage is relatively constant. At the request of the customer, they may be placed on a volume rate of \$4.90 per 1,000 gallons in excess of 2,000 gallons, based upon actual volumes each month.

Note—Mobile home parks and apartment complexes with one meter per multiple units shall be considered commercial.

Note—For residential customers located outside the city limits the rates for discharging normal wastewater into the sanitary sewer system shall be 1½ times the rate for customers inside the city limits.

Note—The average of all samples taken during the month that exceed 250 ppm shall be used to determine the BOD and TSS used in the following formula:
