

ORDINANCE NO. 247

AN ORDINANCE providing for the naming of a public park in the Town of College Place, Washington.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of College Place, Washington:


Section 1: That Charles E. Woodworth was for many years a resident of the Town of College Place, Washington, and devoted liberally of his time, talents and energy to the public welfare of the community and more particularly for programs pertaining to the welfare of children. That one of the projects to which he devoted much time was the development of the ball park located on the tract of land annexed to the Town of College Place under Ordinance No. 217 and adopted by the Town Council on the 6th day of May, 1963.


Section 2: That in recognition of and as a memorial to Charles E. Woodworth, now deceased, the Council does ordain that the park located on said area shall be officially named and known as "Woodworth Memorial Field."

Section 3: The Clerk of the Town of College Place is hereby authorized and directed to furnish notice in writing of the adoption of this ordinance to the immediate family of Charles E. Woodworth. The Superintendent of the Park Department is hereby directed to render such service as may be necessary to assist in the installation of such suitable plaque naming said park as may be furnished by the Kiwanis Club of College Place, Washington.
