ORDINANCE NO. 18-013

**AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLLEGE PLACE, WASHINGTON
TO MODIFY CHAPTER 10.12 OF THE COLLEGE PLACE MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING
PARKING RESTRICTIONS WITHIN THE CITY OF COLLEGE PLACE**

Whereas, the City of College Place is a non-charter code city entitled to the privileges and provisions of RCW 35A; and

Whereas, RCW 35A.11.020 allows non-charter code cities to adopt and enforce ordinances pertaining to local affairs;

Now therefore, the City Council of the City of College Place does hereby Ordain as follows:

Section 1: Ordinance No. 18-013, which replaces language, outlined in Chapter 10.12.020 Restricted Parking Areas and Impounds; and adds language to Chapter 10.12.030 Time Limits on designated Streets to the College Place Municipal Code.

Section 2:

10.12.020 (C) is replaced with the following language:

C. Continuous parking in the same location on any public street or parking area shall not exceed 60 hours. The moving of any vehicle so parked within the same block on either side of the street shall not be deemed to extend the time of parking. Moving a vehicle that has met or exceeded the 60-hour threshold around the block or to any other location and then parking again anywhere within said block is in violation of this section. A 24-hour period of time shall pass prior to the owner or operator of said vehicle being allowed to park again within this specific block.

Section 3:

The following sections are added to 10.12.030 - Time limits on designated streets.

E. Parking on College Avenue between 4th and 8th Streets as well as Whitman Drive to B Street between the hours of 8 AM and 6 PM on weekdays (Monday thru Friday) shall be limited to a maximum period of two hours, enforced by method under the direction of the chief of police.

F. Parking on College Avenue in front of the United States Post Office will be limited to a maximum 15-minute period of time.

G. Parking shall be restricted to areas within the city posted "No Parking", either permanently or under temporary order.

Section 4: Severability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.


Section 5: Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force five days after its passage and publication as provided by law.


