ORDINANCE NO. 23-157

TO AMEND NEW CASTLE COUNTY CODE CHAPTER 13 ("STORMWATER MAINTENANCE DISTRICTS") REGARDING STORMWATER MAINTENANCE AND THORNBERRY COMMUNITY

WHEREAS, stormwater is an important water resource which supports, among other things, groundwater recharge for drinking water supplies and base-flow of streams; and

WHEREAS, the requirements of the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control demand a comprehensive approach to stormwater management by New Castle County; and

WHEREAS, the federal regulations and Delaware state regulations require the County to implement and fund a program of stormwater controls that address discharges from the County's regulated stormwater flows to local water bodies; and

WHEREAS, inadequate management of stormwater runoff throughout a watershed can increase flood depths and velocities, contribute to erosion and sediment, overtax the carrying capacity of existing streams and storm sewers, greatly increase the cost of public facilities to convey and manage stormwater, undermine floodplain management and flood reduction efforts in upstream and downstream communities, reduce groundwater recharge, and impact other related water resource needs and threaten public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, in order to establish, operate, enhance, and maintain an effective and efficient stormwater management, ensure the continued effective operation of the system through installation and best management practices, and to provide other services such as appropriate inspections, asset management, and regulatory oversight associated with stormwater and watershed management, sufficient and stable funding is required to fund these public services; and

WHEREAS, given the above, New Castle County Council determined it to be in the best interests of the County and its residents to create stormwater maintenance districts to accomplish the above and, thereby, promote more attractive, safer, and healthier neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, County Council recently enacted *New Castle County Code* Chapter 13, Sections 13.01.001 – 13.01.007 (by means of Ordinance No. 21-144), creating stormwater maintenance districts to provide an alternative to and assist property owners who are responsible for performing maintenance of stormwater management facilities within residential and mixed-use subdivisions, and to relieve property owners of the burden of the actual maintenance; and

WHEREAS. Chapter 13 provides that a maintenance organization responsible

for a stormwater management facility within a subdivision established prior to enactment

thereof may petition to establish a stormwater maintenance district ("SWD"), using

Department is authorized to determine whether a SWD should be established based on a maintenance organization's compliance with *New Castle County Code* Chapter 12, Article 6 ("Stormwater Management Facility and Watercourse Maintenance"); and WHEREAS, the stormwater management facility in Thornberry falls under the

forms established by the Public Works Department (the "Department"); moreover, the

County's jurisdiction, and is, in the opinion of County government, necessary for efficient and economical stormwater management; and

WHEREAS, by way of background, the Thornberry maintenance organization timely petitioned the Department for creation of a SWD (between July - September, 2023); the petition (attached hereto) reflects the affirmative vote for inclusion in the SWD program by the Thornberry community; and

WHEREAS, the petition includes, among other things, the requisite description of the area incorporated in the proposed SWD, a list of the community members and mailing addresses, applicable parcel numbers, signatures of the community members by parcel, and the individual votes, either yes or no, by community members; and

WHEREAS, the Department supports the petition, which awaits the approval of County Council; and

WHEREAS, if County Council enacts this ordinance, the SWD program will be approved for the Thornberry community; subsequent to any approval by County Council, all relevant information evidencing the establishment of the SWD will be recorded with the Office of the Recorder of Deeds; and

WHEREAS, County Council has determined that the provisions of this Ordinance substantially advance and are reasonably and rationally related to legitimate government interests, including, but not limited to, promoting the public health, safety, welfare, and quality of life of the present and future inhabitants of New Castle County, generally, and the Thornberry community, in particular.

SYNOPSIS: This Ordinance, if approved, approves a Stormwater Maintenance District and will establish a Stormwater District Maintenance Fee for the Thornberry community for the maintenance of one pond servicing 19 lots.

FISCAL NOTE: This Ordinance, if approved, creates a Stormwater Maintenance District and will establish a Stormwater District Maintenance Fee for the Thornberry community. The fee will be included on the County tax bills beginning in the 2024 tax year to cover anticipated costs for a period of 18 months (January 2024 – June 2025). After which time, the annual tax bills beginning with the 2025 tax year will cover anticipated costs for a period of 12 months (July - June). There will be no fiscal impact since the fee shall cover the maintenance and operational costs of the stormwater infrastructure.
