

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-31

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREDERICKSBURG, TEXAS, AMENDING ARTICLE V – SPEED REGULATIONS, OF CHAPTER 44 - TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES - OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, AMENDING THE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT FOR STATE HIGHWAY 16 NORTH (SH 16 N) WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS, DETERMINED UPON THE BASIS OF AN ENGINEERING AND TRAFFIC INVESTIGATION FOR SAID ROADWAY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREDERICKSBURG, TEXAS:

Section 1. That, Chapter 44 - TRAFFIC AND MOTOR VEHICLES, of the Code of Ordinances, is hereby amended by addition of a Section 44-147 as follows:

Sec. 44-147. - Designation of maximum speed limits on specific City streets.

(a) It is hereby determined that the prima facie maximum speed limit on certain portions of State Highway 16 North (SH 16 N) routed within the City limits, is hereby stated as follows, which prima facie maximum speed limit shall be effective at all times, and signs will be erected giving notice of the prima facie maximum speed limit so declared, to wit:

FOR NORTHBOUND TRAFFIC

Beginning at milepoint 18.799 (121 feet north of E. Trailmoor Dr.) to milepoint 18.020 (375 feet north of Ridgewood Dr.), a distance of 0.779 miles, a prima facie maximum speed limit of 45 miles per hour.

From milepoint 18.020 (375 feet north of Ridgewood Dr.) to the northern City Limits at milepoint 17.500 (312 feet north of Ellebracht Dr.), a distance of 0.520 miles, a prima facie maximum speed limit of 55 miles per hour.

FOR SOUTHBOUND TRAFFIC

Beginning at the northern City Limits at milepoint 17.500 (312 feet north of Ellebracht Dr.) to milepoint 18.020 (375 feet north of Ridgewood Dr.), a distance of 0.520 miles, a prima facie maximum speed limit of 55 miles per hour.

From milepoint 18.020 (375 feet north of Ridgewood Dr.) to milepoint 18.799 (121 feet north of E. Trailmoor Dr.), a distance of 0.779 miles, a prima facie maximum speed limit of 45 miles per hour.




Section 3. Repealer. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
