

ORDINANCE NO. 1554

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, TEXAS ADOPTING AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 12:00 MIDNIGHT AND 6:00 P.M. SATURDAY JUNE 8, 2019 ON COMMERCE STREET FROM BOLTON TO AUSTIN STREET; AUSTIN FROM RUSK TO WILSON STREET.; MAIN STREET. FROM COMMERCE TO WILSON STREET.

WHEREAS, certain portions of Main, Commerce, Wilson and Austin Streets will be closed and used for the annual Tomato Fest Celebrations and.

WHEREAS, the City desires to protect the health, safety and welfare of its residents.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, TEXAS:

Section 1. Prohibited areas. No person shall park any vehicle between the hours of 12:00 Midnight and 6:00 p.m., Saturday June 8, 2019 on the following streets:

Commerce Street from Bolton Street to Austin Street;
Austin Street from Rusk Street to Wilson Street;
Main Street from Commerce to Wilson St.

Section 2. Police authorization. The Jacksonville Police Department shall have the authority to have any vehicle located within the limits of the above described streets during the designated time towed at the owner's expense.

Section 3. Affirmative Defenses. It shall be an Affirmative Defense that a vehicle has been given a parking pass by the City of Jacksonville, Texas.

Section 4. Penalties. Violation of this Ordinance is a misdemeanor and is punishable by a fine of not less than \$200.00 nor more than \$500.00.

Section 5. Severability. It is the intention of the City Council of the City of Jacksonville, Texas that if any phrase, sentence, section or paragraph of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by final judgment by a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remainder of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the

incorporation of the unconstitutional or invalid phrase, sentence, section or paragraph.


Section 6. Compliance. A notice was posted and this ordinance was passed in accordance with the Texas Open Meeting Act.

Section 7. Effectiveness. The City Council by the City of Jacksonville, Texas declares that this ordinance shall go into effect after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
