CITY OF CARVER ORDINANCE NO. 04-2025

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 46-51 OF THE CARVER CITY CODE PERTAINING TO PARKING IN CITY-OWNED PARKING LOTS

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARVER, CARVER COUNTY, MINNESOTA, DOES ORDAIN:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Council of the City of Carver hereby amends section 46-51 of the Carver City Code by adding the following new subsection as <u>underlined</u> below:

Sec. 46-51. Prohibitions for stopping, parking.

No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of an officer or traffic control device, in any of the following places:

- (27) *City lot overnight parking restrictions*. No person shall park or otherwise leave standing any motor vehicle in any city-owned parking lot between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. daily, except for under the following circumstances:
 - (i) Overnight parking is allowed in all city-owned parking lots between Friday and Monday during the city's annual Steamboat Days festival;
 - (ii) Overnight parking is allowed overnight in the Broadway Lot, the 3rd Street West Lot, and the Riverside Park Lot; and
 - (iii) Overnight parking may be allowed in any city-owned parking lot with the express written permission of the city manager, or their designee, due to extenuating circumstances. Such permission must be obtained in writing and prior to parking any motor vehicle overnight.

For purposes of this subsection only, the term "city-owned parking lot" shall mean all public parking lots that are owned and operated by the city except for the Broadway Lot, the 3rd Street West Lot, and the Riverside Park Lot, including, without limitation, the following: the Depot Park Lot; the Bluff Park Lot; the Community Park Lot; the Lion's Park Lot; the Ironwood Park Lot; the Fire Station/Public Service Building Lot; the Carver Station Lot; and the Creekside Park Lot.

<u>Section 2</u>. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication in accordance with state law.
