## ORDINANCE NO.

## AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CURFEW RESTRICTIONS IN THE CITY OF EARLVILLE

11-11-92-A

WHEREAS, the City of Earlville, Illinois is empowered to regulate the hours at which unaccompanied youths may be present at public gatherings or in public places under 23 Ill. Rev. Stat. 2372; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Earlville and its citizens have a vested interest in the public health, safety and welfare; and,

WHEREAS, proper maintenance of such health, safety, and welfare involves the regulation of the hours at which unaccompanied youths may be present in public places; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Earlville must provide for such regulation in a way that is at least as restrictive as State law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EARLVILLE, that;

<u>Section 1.</u> The City Council of the City of Earlville finds as facts the recitals hereinabove set forth.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for a person less than 17 years of age to be present at or upon any public assembly, building, place, street or highway in the City of Earlville at the following times unless accompanied and supervised by a parent, legal guardian or other responsible companion at least 18 years of age approved by a parent or legal guardian or unless engaged in a business or occupation which the laws of the State of Illinois authorize a person less than 17 years of age to perform:

- 1. Between 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Saturday;
- 2. Between 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Sunday; and
- 3. Between 11:00 p.m. on Sunday to Thursday,
  - inclusive, and 6:00 a.m. on the following day.

<u>Section 3:</u> It shall be unlawful for a parent, legal guardian or other person to knowingly permit a person in his custody or control to violate Section 2.

<u>Section 4.</u> A person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a petty offense and shall be fined not less than \$10 nor more than \$100.

Section 5. This Amendment shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
