

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-16R

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICKASHA, GRADY COUNTY, STATE OF OKLAHOMA, ESTABLISHING THE FEES TO BE CHARGED FOR RESIDENTIAL REFUSE COLLECTION AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 9-1-6 OF THE CITY OF CHICKASHA CODE OF ORDINANCES; ESTABLISHING THE FEES TO BE CHARGED FOR THE COLLECTION OF LARGE/BULKY ITEMS AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 9-1-10 OF THE CITY OF CHICKASHA CODE OF ORDINANCES; ESTABLISHING THE FEES TO BE CHARGED FOR COMMERCIAL REFUSE COLLECTION AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 9-1-11 OF THE CITY OF CHICKASHA CODE OF ORDINANCES; ESTABLISHING THE FEES TO BE CHARGED FOR MULTI-FAMILY DWELLING SANITATION SERVICE AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 9-1-12 OF THE CITY OF CHICKASHA CODE OF ORDINANCES; ESTABLISHING THE WATER RATES TO BE CHARGED TO CONSUMERS FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY THE CITY WATER SYSTEM AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 18-1-28 OF THE CITY OF CHICKASHA CODE OF ORDINANCES; ESTABLISHING THE FIRE HYDRANT RATES TO BE CHARGED TO CONSUMERS FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY THE CITY WATER SYSTEM AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 18-1-30 OF THE CITY OF CHICKASHA CODE OF ORDINANCES; ESTABLISHING THE SEWER RATES TO BE CHARGED TO CONSUMERS WHO DISCHARGE WASTEWATER INTO THE MUNICIPAL SYSTEM AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 18-4-2 OF THE CITY OF CHICKASHA CODE OF ORDINANCES, AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Chickasha, Grady County, Oklahoma, have determined that it is necessary to establish the rates to be charged for public utilities, inclusive of water service, sewer service, and trash collection pursuant to Sections 9-1-6, 9-1-10, 9-1-11, 9-1-12, 18-1-28, 18-1-30, and 18-4-2 of the City of Chickasha Code of Ordinances;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICKASHA, GRADY COUNTY, STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1. The monthly fees provided for by Section 9-1-6 for residential refuse collection shall be as follows:

<u>TYPE 1 Residential Refuse Collection</u> -	the same being defined as normal residential collection from curbside, street edge, or alley pickup: (a) inside the City Limits - \$13.00 (b) outside the City Limits - \$26.00
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TYPE 2 - Residential Refuse Collection - the same being defined as residential collection at house-side:
 (a) inside City Limits - \$17.80
 (b) outside City Limits - \$35.60

There will be no additional houseside charge for those who cannot physically or safely handle the polycarts, or for those who have property that prevents the polycarts from being moved to the street. These accounts will be charged only for Type 1 collection.

There shall be an additional \$5.50 per month charge for each additional polycart requested beyond the one supplied for refuse and an additional \$5.00 per month charge for each additional polycart requested beyond the one supplied for recycling.

2. The collection fee as provided by Section 9-1-10 of the City of Chickasha Code of Ordinances for the pick-up and disposal of large/bulky items over 3 cubic yards from residential, apartments or commercial customers within the city limits shall be \$9.35 per estimated cubic yard and outside the city limits shall be \$18.70 per estimated cubic yard

3. The monthly fees for commercial refuse collection as provided by Section 9-1-11 of the City of Chickasha Code Ordinances shall be as follows:

A. Dumpster costs can be split with more than one business, but not more than four.

B. Rates below are for various size containers offered by the City and its contractor. Rates outside City Limits are double rates quoted below.

4. The monthly rates for multi-family sanitation refuse collection provided for in Section 9-1-12 shall be in the amount set forth as follows:

- A. Each unit in multi-family dwelling complex within the City limits - \$13.00 per unit.
- B. Each unit in a multi-family dwelling unit outside the City limits - \$26.00 per unit.

5. The monthly water rates to be charged for consumers of water supplied by the City water system provided for by Section 18-1-28 shall be established in the following amounts:

- A. Basic water rates inside the City limits:
 - 0 – 2,000 gallons \$11.15 minimum
 - 2,000 – 25,000 gallons \$2.75 per 1,000 gallon
 - 25,001– 50,000 gallons \$3.00 per 1,000 gallon
 - 50,001– 75,000 gallons \$3.35 per 1,000 gallon
 - 75,001 – 100,000 gallons \$3.60 per 1,000 gallon
 - 100,001 gallons and above \$4.00 per 1,000 gallon
- B. Basic water rates outside the City limits: Is two times the inside the city rates as listed in 5A above.

C. Industrial Bulk Users (defined as a non-residential user, using in excess of 100,000 gallons of water in a billing period, who is zoned Industrial or is on a valid water contract.)

0 – 2,000 gallons \$11.15 minimum
2,001 and above gallons \$2.75 per 1,000 gallon

- D. Water Meter re-read request. The customer may request one re-read per year for no additional charge; however, if additional re-reads are requested then there will be a \$23.00 charge per reading placed on the next water billing. If the initial meter reading is incorrect then the re-read charge will be waived.
- E. Re-connect fee \$38.00
- F. Pulled meter fee \$76.00

6. The Fire Hydrants rates to be charged for consumers of water supplied by the City water system provided for by Section 18-1-30 shall be established in the following amounts:

- A. Basic water rates inside the City limits:
 - \$6.00 per 1,000 gallons

7. The monthly sewer rates charged for consumers who discharge wastewater into the municipal system provided by Section 18-4-2 shall be established in the following amounts:

- A. Basic sewer rates inside the City Limits:
\$3.60 plus \$3.00 per 1,000 gallons of metered water consumed.
- B. Basic sewer rates outside the City Limits:
\$7.20 plus \$6.00 per 1,000 gallons of metered water consumed.

8. These rates become effective with the February 2015 billing cycle.
