

**CITY OF MAUSTON  
ORDINANCE 2021-2044**

**Amending Chapter 6, Section 6-25(a) and 6-26(7) Regarding the Issuance of Provisional Licenses**

The Common Council of the City of Mauston, Juneau County, Wisconsin, does hereby amend and ordain Chapter 6, Section 6-25(a) and Section 6-26(7) of the City of Mauston Code of Ordinances as follows:

Sec. 6-25. - Classes, fees and number.

(a) The following classes and denominations of licenses may be issued by the city clerk, or his/her designee, under the authority of the city council upon compliance with the specified law and payment of the fee established by the city:

- (1) Class A fermented malt beverage license under Wis. Stats. § 125.25.
- (2) Class A cider license, per Wis. Stats. § 125.51(2).
- (3) Class B fermented malt beverage license under Wis. Stats. § 125.26(1).
- (4) Class B fermented malt beverage six-month license under Wis. Stats. § 125.26(5).
- (5) Temporary class B fermented malt beverage license under Wis. Stats. § 125.26(6).
- (6) Class A intoxicating liquor license under Wis. Stats. § 125.51(2).
- (7) Class B intoxicating liquor license under Wis. Stats. § 125.51(3).
- (8) Temporary class B intoxicating liquor (wine) license under Wis. Stats. § 125.51(10).
- (9) Operator's license under Wis. Stats. § 125.17(1).
- (10) Temporary operator's license under Wis. Stats. § 125.17(4).
- (11) Provisional Operator's license under Wis. Stats. § 125.17(5).
- (12) Provisional Retail License under Wis. Stats. § 125.185
- (13) Class C license under Wis. Stats. § 125.51(3m).


(b) As of December 1, 1997, the city had 13 class B liquor licenses. The population in 1997 was 3,609. For every 500 capita increase, the city receives one additional reserve license.

Sec. 6-26. - Additional requirements.

In addition to all statutory requirements, the following requirements shall be fulfilled for each license:


- (7) *Provisional licenses.* An application form for provisional licenses, prepared by the city, shall be filed with the clerk.
- City clerk, or his/her designee is authorized to issue provisional licenses.
  - The 15-day period per Wis. Stats. § 125.04(3)(f) does not apply to provisional licenses.
  - Application fees for provisional license and operator's/retail license must be paid before a provisional license is issued.
  - If applicant does not meet the criteria of Wis. Stats. § 125.17(5)(a)2, a provisional license may be issued after applicant submits payment of applicable fees, a clear background check, and proof of beverage server's course successful completion if applicable.
