11 12	WHEREAS, the Town of Hillsboro Beach has proven to be a desirable location in which to film motion pictures and other commercial productions; and
13	WHEREAS, in order to provide for the coordination of such productions on publicly-
14	owned or privately controlled property and to ensure that it does not affect public safety or
15 16	impede with the government business or public access, the Town Commission finds that the passage of this Ordinance is in the best interests of the citizens of the Town of Hillsboro
17	Beach;
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19	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN OF HILLSBORO BEACH, FLORIDA THAT:
20	Section 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being
21	true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance.
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23	Section 2. Chapter 7 entitled "Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions" is hereby amended by
24	specifically creating Article XII to be entitled "Film production on publicly-owned or privately
25 26	controlled property" which shall read as follows:

39	Film means still, live or motion picture production whether made on or by film, electronic

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Required. No person shall film within a publicly owned site, facility or right-of-way

Individuals filming or videotaping only for their own personal or family use.

Employees of print or electronic news media when filming ongoing news

within the Town without first obtaining a permit. Permits may be authorized at the sole discretion of

Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

Section 5. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances and all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

10 <u>Section 6</u>. It is the intention of the Town Commission of the Town of Hillsboro Beach, 11 that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of 12 Town of Hillsboro Beach, Florida, and the Sections of this ordinance may be renumbered, re-lettered 13 and the word "Ordinance" may be changed to "Section," "Article," or such other word or phrase in 14 order to accomplish such intention.

<u>Section 7.</u> This Ordinance shall be effective on after its passage and adoption by the
Town Commission of the Town of Hillsboro Beach.
