ORDINANCE 22-051

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WHEREAS, Section 6(a) of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that any municipality which has a population of more than 25,000 is a home rule unit, and the Village of Bolingbrook, Will and DuPage counties, Illinois, with a population in excess of 25,000 is, therefore, a home rule unit and, pursuant to the provisions of said Section 6(a) of Article VII, may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including, but not limited to, the power to tax and to incur debt; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees may amend the Bolingbrook Village Code from time to time to meet the changing needs of the Village and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find it to be in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the Village and its citizens to amend Chapter 50 "Traffic and Vehicles" of the Bolingbrook Village Code to regulate parking in residential yards.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BOLINGBROOK, WILL AND DU PAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The Mayor and Board of Trustees find as facts the recitals hereinabove set forth.

SECTION 2: Section 50-44 "Parking or storing of certain types of vehicles restricted" of Chapter 50 "Traffic and Vehicles" of the Bolingbrook Village Code is hereby amended by eliminating the stricken text and adding the underlined text as follows:

Sec. 50-44. Parking or storing of certain types of vehicles restricted.

- (a) No automobiles, house trailers, camping trailers, boat trailers, camping buses, camper trucks, buses, trucks or other trailers or motor vehicles shall be stored or parked in any front, side or rear yard, or upon any grass or vegetation in any residential district. ~~or in any side yard in any residential district that is adjacent to the right-of-way line of a public street.~~ A vehicle shall be deemed to have been stored or parked when it is stationed, stopped, or standing anywhere within any such ~~front or side~~ yard, except on a driveway.

- (b) No recreational vehicle, including, but not limited to, camping trailers, boat trailers, boats, camping buses, or camper trucks, shall be stored in a driveway in any front yard in a residential district or in any side yard in any residential district that is adjacent to the right-of-way line of a public street. A recreational vehicle shall be deemed to have been stored on a driveway in any such front or side yard when it has been parked there for more than 48 hours in any week.
- (c) No trucks, buses, trailers, or other types of motor vehicles which either exceed nine feet in height or 20 feet in length or 8,000 pounds in gross weight shall be parked or stored in any area within a residential district.
- (d) No vehicles or part thereof which is unlicensed, has an expired state motor vehicle license, has an expired municipal motor vehicle license, is abandoned, is wrecked, is dismantled or is in an inoperative condition may be stored outdoors on an open trailer, anywhere within any such front, side, or rear yard, including any grass areas of any private or public property, or under a nondesignated car cover, or unless such vehicle is stored or parked in a lawful manner on private property in connection with the business of a licensed dismantler, licensed vehicle dealer or a junk yard. Such vehicles or parts thereof, covered by a designated car cover as authorized herein, are limited to two (2) per property.
- (e) No privately owned commercial vehicle, including but not limited to truck cab or trailer, or contractor's equipment shall be stored or parked within any parking lot or loading area or behind a commercial center or building in any commercial zoning district unless said vehicle is being used to make a delivery or render a service to a business occupying the property or unless the storage of commercial vehicles or contractor's equipment has been approved in accordance with the Village's Zoning Ordinance.

SECTION 3: Section 50-46 "Penalty for Parking Violations" of Chapter 50 "Traffic and Vehicles" is hereby amended by eliminating the stricken text and adding the underlined text as follows:

10.	Within 20 feet of a driveway entrance to a fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within 75 feet of the entrance when properly sign posted	\$30.00
11.	Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when such parking would obstruct traffic	\$30.00
12.	On the roadway side of any vehicle parked at the edge or curb of a street	\$30.00
13.	Upon bridge, elevated structure, on highway or in highway tunnel	\$30.00
14.	At any place where official signs prohibit parking	\$30.00
15.	At any place where posted signs and/or painted curbing indicate a specified area as a fire lane	\$50.00
16.	Parking on a village street between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.	\$30.00
17.	Parking on a street during snow removal or street cleaning operations	\$30.00
18.	Unattended motor vehicle standing without stopped engine, locked ignition, removed key, or if on grade without brake set and wheels turned	\$30.00
19.	Repairing a motor vehicle on the street for other than emergency purposes	\$50.00
20.	Moving of parked vehicle by unauthorized persons	\$30.00
21.	Angle parking	\$30.00
22.	Failure of vehicle lessor to provide written statement	\$50.00
23.	Storage of vehicles on private or public property	\$50.00
24.	Parking on sidewalk or parkway	\$75.00
25.	Parking or storing vehicles in other specified prohibited places	\$50.00
26.	Parking unauthorized vehicles in a parking space designated for handicapped parking	\$250.00
27.	Parking a scrapping vehicle for greater than ten (10) minutes	\$100.00

SECTION 4: Article II "Parking, Standing and Stoppling" of Chapter 50 "Traffic and Vehicles" is hereby amended by adding the following underlined section:

Section 50-48. Scrapping Vehicles.

- (a) Any vehicle used to buy, sell, collect, gather, or deliver junk within the Village shall not be parked for a period greater than ten (10) minutes in a residential district. To the extent that a vehicle is otherwise in compliance with this Chapter, such vehicle may be parked or left standing on the Village streets and

highways while actively engaged in loading and unloading of junk as long as such vehicle is not left unattended for a period greater than ten (10) minutes.

- (b) Any vehicle used to buy, sell, collect, gather, or deliver junk may not be modified from its factory production to facilitate additional hauling capacity. All junk shall be kept securely fastened while a vehicle is in motion. Junking material may not be stored at the end of the day on the vehicle. Junking material shall not be stored in a residential district.
- (c) "Junk" is defined as any secondhand or used materials of any kind that may be recycled or converted to new materials or products, including but not limited to, rags, paper, rubbish, bottles, glassware, cookery, bags, cloth, rubber, tires, ferrous and nonferrous metals, clothing, siphons, old rope, plumbing materials, salvage gas and electrical fixtures, waste materials, and all articles and things discarded including secondhand motor vehicles and parts thereof.

SECTION 5: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6: All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 7: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.



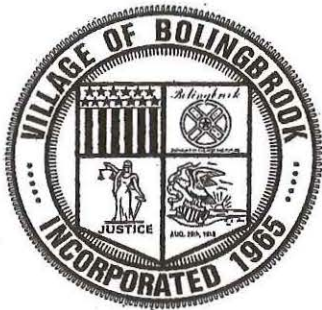
