ORDINANCE NO. 2022-1**

ARTICLE III. – VEHICLE RESTRICTIONS

Sec.46-80. - Restrictions upon use of streets by certain vehicles.

- (a) The city with respect to highways under their jurisdiction, may prohibit the operation of trucks or other commercial vehicles, or may impose limitations as to the weight thereof, on designated highways, which prohibitions and limitations shall be designated by appropriate signs placed on such highways.
- (b) Prohibited Operation of Trucks and Other Commercial Vehicles.
 - 1) Except as otherwise permitted in subsection 2) below, no person shall operate a commercial vehicle exceeding ten thousand (10,000) pounds gross vehicle weight upon any city streets listed in subsection (d).
 - 2) This section does not apply to:
 - i. Vehicles operated on the prohibited street for the purpose of delivering or picking up materials or merchandise or people within the restricted street segment. Such vehicles must enter the prohibited street at the intersection nearest the destination of the vehicle and proceeding thereon no farther than the nearest intersection thereafter.
 - ii. Any vehicle owned by a public utility while in use to construct, install, maintain or repair any public utility.
 - iii. Government vehicles.
 - 3) The violation of this section is a petty offense punishable by a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
- (c) Erection of signs designating prohibitions.
 - 1) The city shall cause necessary signs to be posted along the streets designated in subsection (d) below informing the general public of the truck restrictions. When signs are erected giving notice of such restrictions, any person failing to comply with the notice shall be deemed guilty of a petty offense.
- (d) Restricted Streets.
 - 1) Pulaski Road, from 3rd Avenue Northeast to Calder Avenue.
