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CODE FOR THE VILLAGE OF OSWEGO, KENDALL AND WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

(NO PARKING RULES TIME LIMITATION)

WHEREAS, the Village of Oswego (“Village”) has a population of more than 25,000 and is therefore a “Home Rule Unit” under the 1970 Illinois Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Constitution of 1970 provides that a Home Rule Unit may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including but not limited to the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; to license, to tax; and to incur debt; and

WHEREAS, the Village is also operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1, et seq.), and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village is specifically authorized by the Illinois Municipal Code to regulate traffic upon the streets, including parking upon and along the streets; and

WHEREAS, the Village finds it in the interest of public health, safety, and welfare to amend its ordinance as it pertains to parking to allow the Village to install signage to limit parking in certain areas by time.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OSWEGO, KENDALL AND WILL COUNTIES, ILLINOIS IN THE EXERCISE OF THEIR HOME RULE, STATUTORY AND OTHER POWERS, as follows:

Section 1: That provisions of Title 9 of the Village Code of the Village of Oswego are hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 2. ORDINANCE AMENDED

Sec. 9-4-1. No parking rules.

At any time it shall be unlawful to permit any vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other vehicles or in compliance with the direction of traffic policemen or signals, to stand in any of the following places:

- (A) In any intersection.
- (B) In a crosswalk.
- (C) Upon any bridge or viaduct, or in any subway or the approach thereto.
- (D) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 20 feet of a point on the curb immediately opposite the end of a safety zone.
- (E) Within 30 feet of a traffic signal or a through street sign on the approaching side.
- (F) Within 20 feet of any intersection.
- (G) At any place where the standing of a vehicle reduces the usable width of the roadway for moving traffic to less than 18 feet.
- (H) At any curb within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
- (I) At any place where the vehicle would block the use of a driveway.
- (J) Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing.
- (K) Within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to any fire department station and on the side of the street opposite the entrance to any fire station, within 75 feet of said entrance.
- (L) On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge of a curb or street.
- (M) At any place where official signs prohibit parking.
- (N) It shall be unlawful to permit any vehicle to stand or park for a period of time that exceeds the time limitation at any place where official signs restrict parking by time.

Section 2: SEVERABILITY

This ordinance and every provision thereof shall be considered severable. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall remain and continue in full force and effect.

Section 3: REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, approval and publication in this pamphlet form which is hereby authorized, as provided by law.
