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(Administration)

WHEREAS, the Village of Oswego ("Village") has a population of more than 25,000 and is therefore a "Home Rule Unit" under the 1970 Illinois Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Constitution of 1970 provides that a Home Rule Unit may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including but not limited to the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; to license, to tax; and to incur debt; and

WHEREAS, the Village has in full force and effect a codified set of those ordinances of the Village which are of a general and permanent nature, which said codified set is known and designated as the Village Code of the Village of Oswego, as amended; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the village to maintain consistent appointive officers by eliminating appointive terms coinciding with presidential elections; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the village to adhere to section 1-14-2 of the village code defining the village administrator as the supervisor of all village employees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF OSWEGO, KENDALL AND WILL COUNTIES, ILLINOIS IN THE EXERCISE OF THEIR HOME RULE, STATUTORY AND OTHER POWERS, as follows:

Section 1: The provision of Section 1-5-4 and Section 1-6-2 are hereby as follows:

1-5-4: TERMS OF OFFICE:

(B) *Appointive officers*. Every appointive officer of the village shall hold office for a term to coincide with the<u>ir term of employment</u>. Term of the village president unless it is otherwise provided by ordinance. The term of appointed officers shall automatically end if the officer is terminated as an employee.

1-6-2: DUTIES

The president shall be the chief executive officer of the village, and shall perform such duties as may be required of them him by statute or ordinance. They He shall have supervision over all of the executive officers and employees of the village, and shall have the power and authority to inspect all books and records pertaining to village affairs and kept by any officer or employee of the village, at any reasonable time.

Section 2: SEVERABILITY

This ordinance and every provision thereof shall be considered severable. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall remain and continue in full force and effect.

Section 3: REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, approval and publication in this pamphlet form which is hereby authorized, as provided by law.

Sec. 1-5-4. Terms of office.

- (A) Elected officials. The village president and members of the board of trustees shall take office and begin their term of office at the commencement of the first regular or special meeting of the president and board of trustees following certification of the election results for said offices.
- (B) Appointive officers. Every appointive officer of the village shall hold office for a term to coincide with the<u>ir</u> term of employment. term of the village president unless it is otherwise provided by ordinance. The term of appointed officers shall automatically end if the officer is terminated as an employee.

Sec. 1-6-2. Duties.

The president shall be the chief executive officer of the village, and shall perform such duties as may be required of <u>them him</u> by statute or ordinance. <u>They</u> He shall have <u>supervision over all of the executive officers and</u> employees of the village, and shall have the power and authority to inspect all books and records pertaining to village affairs and kept by any officer or employee of the village, at any reasonable time.
