AN ORDINANCE SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 332 (VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC) ARTICLE II (TRAFFIC REGULATIONS) SECTION 332-9 (STOP INTERSECTIONS) MULTI-WAY STOPS AT WARREN STREET AND MORRIS STREET AND AT WARREN STREET AND YORK STREET.

COUNCIL AS A WHOLE offered and moved adoption of the following ordinance:

- Chapter 332 (Vehicles and Traffic) Article II (Traffic Regulations) of the Jersey City Code is hereby supplemented as follows:

Section 332-9

**SCHEDULE
STOP INTERSECTION**

The intersections listed below are hereby designated as a stop intersection. Stop signs shall be installed as provided therein.

Street 1 (Stop Sign On)	Direction of Travel	Street 2 (At Intersection)	
Morris St	East	Warren St	- <u>Multi-way</u>
<u>Warren St</u>	<u>North and South</u>	<u>Morris St</u>	- <u>Multi-way</u>
<u>Warren St</u>	<u>South</u>	<u>York St</u>	- <u>Multi-way</u>
York St	East	Warren St	- <u>Multi-way</u>

- All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- The City Clerk and the Corporation Counsel may change any chapter numbers, article numbers and section numbers if codification of this ordinance reveals a conflict between those numbers and the existing code, in order to avoid confusion and possible accidental repealers of existing provisions.
- This ordinance shall be a part of the Jersey City Code as though codified and incorporated in the official copies of the Jersey City Code.

Purpose

The purpose of this ordinance is to designate the intersection of Warren Street and Morris Street as well as Warren Street and York Street as multi-way stop control to improve the traffic safety and operational characteristics due to the geometry of the intersections. Warren Street and York Street is a T-intersection and the southbound approach of Warren Street operates as a de-facto stop approach. Designating Warren Street as a "stop" street, in conjunction with appropriate signage and striping, will increase traffic safety. Warren Street changes from a one-way to a two-way street at Morris Street. Designating this intersection as a multi-way stop would help reduce the number of vehicles traveling the wrong way on Warren Street.
