

WHEREAS, the Town of Glenmora, Louisiana, in accordance with La. R.S. 33:406(A)(1), wishes to amend the ordinance on the following codes for the Town of Glenmora.

Whereas, in legal session convened, that the ordinances for Traffic and Vehicles should be amended to protect the interests of the Town of Glenmora.

The following changes are to be made in the Town of Glenmora municipal code, chapter 40.

• **Sec. 40-15. - Parking prohibited in certain locations, certain days and hours.**

*The area in Town of Glenmora right of way may not be used to park commercial related vehicles larger than two tons in weight. Such use could be damaging to utilities, and essential characteristics of residential neighborhoods. These type vehicles must be parked away from right of ways and in designated and approved areas or on private property, away from Town of Glenmora right of ways.*

• **Sec. 40-11. - Vehicle weight limits established.**

It is unlawful for any person to operate on any street any motor vehicle, or other vehicle, tractor, trailer or tractor-trailer combination, having an aggregate or gross weight equal to or greater than the weight specified for that vehicle designated by the town on the streets and/or highways or portions of streets and highways designated by the town. Large commercial vehicles, tractor, trailer or tractor-trailer combination, are only allowed on designated streets or roads inside the Town limits. These are State maintained highways, Parish maintained roads, 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Ashmore Road, and 7<sup>th</sup> Street. Travel by these vehicles on any other street in Town will need prior authorization from the Town of Glenmora.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF GLENMORA, LOUISIANA, the above ordinance was read, considered and a motion to introduced the ordinance was given by

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, BY THE MAYOR AND THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF GLENMORA, LOUISIANA, voted on by Yea or Nay votes, introduced this ordinance at the regular meeting held on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2019, in regular session introduce this ordinance with a final vote being as follows:

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, BY THE MAYOR AND THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF GLENMORA, LOUISIANA, voted on by Yea or Nay votes to adopt this ordinance at the regular meeting held on the 10 day of June, 2019, in regular session adopt this ordinance with a final vote being as follows:



After discussion and debate, the ordinance changes were made to reflect the following:

- **Sec. 40-15. - Parking prohibited in certain locations, certain days and hours.**

[ *Commercial vehicles*]. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing any commercial vehicle in excess of one (1) ton, including school buses, on a public street or public easement in an area zoned for single-family residential use. This prohibition shall not apply to any commercial vehicle which is being loaded or unloaded in the normal course of business.

It is unlawful for any person to operate on any street any motor vehicle, or other vehicle, tractor, trailer or tractor-trailer combination, having an aggregate or gross weight equal to or greater than the weight specified for that vehicle designated by the town on the streets and/or highways or portions of streets and highways designated by the town.

- **Sec. 40-11. - Vehicle weight limits established.**

- **Truck routes; weight restrictions; special permits.**

- (a) No motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, tandem semi-trailer or light trailer having a gross weight of more than five (5) tons shall not be operated on any hard-surfaced street within the corporate limits of the town, the following streets or portions thereof being excluded from this provision, to wit:

*State highways maintained by the state*

*Roads and highways maintained by Rapides Parish*

*5<sup>th</sup> Avenue*

*7<sup>th</sup> Street*

*Ashmorre Road*

- (b) The gross weights of vehicles allowed on streets named and designated above shall be as follows, to wit:
- (1) Single axle truck, eighteen thousand (18,000) pounds gross weight.
  - (2) Tandem truck, thirty-two thousand (32,000) pounds gross weight.
  - (3) Tandem truck and trailer, sixty-four thousand (64,000) pounds gross weight.
  - (c) Trucks carrying farm, agricultural and/or forest products shall be prohibited on streets others than those named and designated above.
- (d) Those streets designated above shall be designated and marked as truck routes.
- (e) A special written permit may be obtained from the town hall in the event it is necessary to operate a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, tandem semitrailer or light trailer on any street within the corporate limits of the town having a gross weight in excess of the weight limitations hereinabove provided, in the event that it is shown that the following factors exist:
- (1) There is a vital and exceptional economic necessity therefor;
  - (2) There is no means of transportation other than the public highway available;
  - (3) The shipment cannot be broken; and,
  - (4) It is considered that the interest of the town requires the issuance of the permit.
- (f) Delivery trucks, trailers, semitrailers, tandem semitrailers, or light trailers having a gross weight of more than five (5) tons, but weighing less than the weight recited above in (b), making deliveries to residents or merchants shall be exempted from the provisions of this section.

- **Vehicles carrying oversize loads.**

- (a) *Permit required.* It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person to operate a truck or vehicle on the streets or public roads of the city loaded with a load which is in excess of eight (8) feet in width, or which load projects more than twelve and one-half (12½) feet from the surface of the street in height, without first obtaining a permit from the city police department. The moving of houses or buildings through the streets or over a portion of the streets, in such a way as to block or



partially obstruct traffic, shall be construed to come within this section, and a permit shall be required therefor as provided in this section.

- (b) *Permit fee.* Any person desiring to obtain a permit required by paragraph (a) of this section shall pay the following fees:

(1) For the first half hour or fraction thereof that such loaded vehicle is within the limits of the town, the fee shall be five dollars (\$25.00).

(2) For each additional hour or fraction thereof, such vehicle is within the limits of the town, an additional fee of five dollars (\$5.00) will be charged.

- (c) *Issuance of permit.* The permit required by paragraph (a) of this section shall be issued by the town at the Town Hall. Such permit shall be in writing and a duplicate kept at the police station.

- (d) *Disposition of permit fees.* The fees collected for permits required by paragraph (a) of this section by the town deposited in the general fund and shall be used for the needs of the town.

- (e) *Exemption as to mobile homes.* Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this section, any person moving mobile houses or trailers originating from a factory or sales lot into the town shall be required to first obtain a permit as provided in this section, provided that the person moving the mobile home across the streets of the town or a portion of the streets, shall furnish his own escort with an emergency type vehicle equipped with flashing or amber lights. Notice to the Police department will be required for traffic control and movement into the town is required to be completed between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

• **Fines for non-compliance.**

- (a) Violators shall be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) on first offenses, and not less than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) on second offenses, and not less than (\$300.00) on third or greater offenses.




