

**ORDINANCE NO. 1016**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CORTE MADERA  
REPEALING CHAPTER 1.08 OF THE CORTE MADERA MUNICIPAL CODE -  
POSTING OF ORDINANCES AND NOTICES**

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**WHEREAS**, Government Code § 36933 requires the City Clerk to publish in a newspaper or post in at least three public places all adopted ordinances within 15 days after passage in order for the ordinance to go into effect and Ordinance No. 870, adopted November 5, 2001, designated the three public posting places approved by Council; and

**WHEREAS**, Corte Madera Town Hall, one of the three designated posting locations, is scheduled to be demolished and rebuilt, and in preparation for the upcoming project, Town operations and staff have relocated to a temporary Town Hall facility, necessitating an update of the approved posting locations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Attorney has recommended repeal of Chapter 1.08 and has advised setting posting locations by resolution in order to more easily facilitate future anticipated changes to posting locations.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CORTE MADERA  
DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.     Amendment to the Corte Madera Municipal Code**

The Corte Madera Municipal Code is hereby amended to repeal Chapter 1.08 as follows:

~~The following are established as the official places for the posting of all ordinances, resolutions, notices and other documents required by law to be posted:~~

- ~~(1) Town Hall, Tamalpais Drive and Willow Avenue, Corte Madera, California;~~
- ~~(2) United States Post Office, 7 Pixley Avenue, Corte Madera, California;~~
- ~~(3) 5600 Paradise Drive, Corte Madera, California.~~

~~1.08.020 – Posting.~~

~~The ordinance codified in this chapter shall be posted in three public places within the town and shall become effective on December 6, 2001.~~

**Section 2.     Severability**

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the ordinance.

The Town Council hereby declares that it would have passed this and each section, subsection, phrase or clause thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, phrases or clauses be declared unconstitutional on their face or as applied.

**Section 3.     Effective Date**

This ordinance shall go into effect thirty (30) days after the date of its passage and adoption.

**Section 4.     Posting**

The Town Clerk shall cause a summary of this ordinance to be published in the Marin Independent Journal within 5 days prior to passage and within 15 days after passage.

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This ordinance was introduced on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2022, and adopted on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March, 2022 by the following vote:
