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The Council of the City of Manhattan Beach, California, does
ordain as follows:

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT OF CODE. Article 7 is hereby added to Chapter 7, Title 4 of said Code to read as follows:

No person without first having applied for and received a permit from the City Manager, as provided in this Article, shall make any appeal to the public for a charity or charitable or religious purpose, either by soliciting or collecting gifts, contributions, donations or subscriptions or by promoting or conducting any sale, bazaar or exhibition or by any other means whatsoever at any place or to any person in the city.

No person without first having applied for and received a permit from the City Manager, as provided in this Article, shall sell or solicit for or on behalf of any person, firm, association or corporation, by telephone or otherwise, for the sale of any ticket or right to admission to any amusement, show, entertainment, lecture or other enterprise not regularly carried on for private profit or gain by such person, firm, association or corporation at a fixed place of business in the city, or solicit any contribution or gift in connection with any such amusement, show, entertainment, lecture or other enterprise where such sale or solicitation is for other than a charitable purpose and is made to persons other than the

1 bona fide members of the firm, association or corporation,
2 causing such solicitation or sale, or for or on whose behalf
3 such solicitation or sale is made, and where, in connection
4 with any such amusement, show, entertainment, lecture or
5 other enterprise it is represented, advertised, held out,
6 implied or made to appear that such sale, solicitation, con-
7 tribution or gift or any part of the proceeds therefrom shall
8 belong to, or be devoted or used for the benefit of any person,
9 firm, association or corporation.

10 SEC. 4-7. 703. Application for Permit.

11 Any person desiring to do any of the actions mentioned
12 in Section 4-7. 701 or 4-7. 702, shall file an application with
13 the City Manager. Said application shall set forth the follow-
14 ing information:

15 (1) Name and address of the applicant. Whether the
16 applicant is affiliated with or working for any other or-
17 ganization than the one for which this solicitation is intended.

18 (2) Location of national, state and local headquarters,
19 if any.

20 (3) The names and addresses of all persons directly
21 interested in or who in any manner will be engaged in the
22 work.

23 (4) The exact purpose for which the proceeds of the
24 solicitation, sale, bazaar, exhibition, promotion, amusement,
25 show, lecture, entertainment or other enterprise or any part
26 thereof, are to be used, including the manner in which and
27 the amount of any compensation intended to be paid to any
28 person, firm, association or corporation out of such proceeds.

29 (5) The total amount which is sought to be raised.

30 (6) The bank or place where all or any part of the funds
31 raised by such activity will be placed on deposit or invested.

32 (7) What records of funds received will be kept and

1 where. Where such records will be open to the public.

2 (8) Whether the uniform or identification worn or
3 carried resembles that of any other group in this area
4 conducting a similar type of activity.

5 (9) Such other information in respect to the character
6 and past and proposed activity of the applicant and the
7 parties directly interested in or engaged in the work as
8 may be necessary to enable the City Manager to make a
9 full and complete investigation.

10 SEC. 4-7.704. Investigation.

11 The City Manager, upon receipt of an application
12 complying with the requirements of Section 4-7.703 and
13 containing the information required thereby, shall conduct
14 such investigation as he may deem necessary.

15 SEC. 4-7.705. Permit Granting or Denying.

16 Should the City Manager, after a complete investi-
17 gation of the applicant and of the representations contained
18 in the application, be of the opinion that the applicant has
19 not stated true facts in his application, or that if a permit
20 should be granted to the applicant a fraud in all probability
21 would be perpetrated upon the public, the said City Manager
22 may refuse to issue a permit to such applicant.

23 Should the City Manager be satisfied that the appli-
24 cation is truthful, that the applicant is acting in good faith
25 and that in all probability a fraud would not be perpetrated
26 upon the public, a permit shall be issued to such applicant
27 for such period of time as the applicant may request. Pro-
28 vided, however, that no permit shall be valid for a period
29 of more than six months from the date of issuance; and
30 provided further that as a condition to granting such permit
31 the City Manager may require the applicant to file a bond
32 with the City Clerk in the sum of \$1,000.00 in a form

1 approved by the City Attorney and conditioned that if the
2 principal thereof shall fail to devote, pay or use the entire
3 proceeds or the percentage thereof specified in the appli-
4 cation, derived from the activity mentioned in the appli-
5 cation to the person, firm, association or corporation for
6 or on whose account or benefit such activity was conducted
7 or carried on, then the surety will pay the same to such
8 person, firm, association or corporation, to the amount of
9 such bond.

10 SEC. 4-7.706. Exception.

11 No permit shall be required for the solicitation of
12 gifts, contributions, donations or subscriptions, or the
13 promotion of any bazaar, sale, or exhibition or other act
14 of appeal to the public for a charity, made by the members
15 of any religious or charitable organization which has been in
16 existence in, and which regularly has maintained headquarters
17 or a place of worship in the City of Manhattan Beach for a
18 period of at least five years next preceding the date on
19 which such activity shall be begun; provided, that the City
20 Manager has issued a permit authorizing the conducting
21 or carrying on of such activity by such organization. Appli-
22 cations for such permits shall be made to the City Manager
23 within sixty days from the effective date of this section and
24 shall be issued by him in accordance with the standards pro-
25 vided in Section 4-7.705. Such permits shall be valid until
26 revoked by the City Manager.

27 SEC. 4-7.707. Permits. Revocation.

28 Any permit issued may be revoked if the permittee is
29 not operating in accordance with the application pursuant to
30 which such permit was issued or if further activity of said
31 permittee would operate to defraud the public. Such revo-
32 cation may be made by a registered letter signed by the

1 City Clerk at the direction of the City Manager and directed
2 to the address of the applicant as stated upon the appli-
3 cation pursuant to which the permit was issued. Said per-
4 mit shall become null and void on and after the third day
5 from the date after which said letter is deposited in the
6 United States Post Office in the City of Manhattan Beach.
7 SEC. 4-7.708. Solicitation by Mail.

8 No permit shall be required for any solicitation through
9 the United States mail.

10 SEC. 4-7.709. Telephone Solicitation.

11 No person shall use or cause to be used a telephone to
12 accomplish any of the acts set forth in Sections 4-7.701 or
13 4-7.702, unless such person is a bona fide member of an
14 organization in whose name a permit has been issued pursuant
15 to the provisions of this Article and provided further that such
16 person making such solicitation does not receive any com-
17 pensation therefor.

18 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall go
19 into effect and be in full force and operation from and after thirty (30)
20 days after its final passage and adoption.

21 SECTION 4. PUBLICATION. The City Clerk shall certify
22 to the passage and adoption of this ordinance; shall enter the same in
23 the book of original ordinances of said City; shall make a minute of the
24 passage and adoption thereof in the records of the proceedings of the
25 City Council at which the same is passed and adopted; and shall within
26 fifteen days from the passage and adoption thereof cause the same to
27 be published once in the Manhattan Beach News, a weekly newspaper
28 of general circulation, published and circulated within said City of
29 Manhattan Beach and which is hereby designated for that purpose.
