**ORDINANCE NO. 22-10-49**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5.76, ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS,  
AND CHAPTER 5.98, LOCAL VIDEO GAMING LICENSES,  
OF THE VILLAGE OF MUNDELEIN MUNICIPAL CODE**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Mundelein is an Illinois municipal corporation (the "Village") with home rule authority and the adoption of this ordinance is being done through its home rule powers;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Mundelein, County of Lake, Illinois, that:

**SECTION I.** Section 5.76.090, Payment of Fees, of the Mundelein Municipal Code shall be amended to read as follows:

A.     Application Fee. At the time an original application or an application for a transfer is made for a license hereunder, a non-refundable application fee of two hundred fifty dollars shall be deposited with the local liquor control commissioner of the village. In the event that any license applied for is granted, the full amount payable, as provided in Section 5.76.60 of this chapter, for the license shall be deposited with the local liquor control commissioner before any license is issued (which shall be in addition to the two hundred fifty-dollar application fee). All sums so deposited with the local liquor control commissioner shall be turned over to the village treasurer and shall be placed by the village treasurer in the general corporate fund of the village or in such other fund as shall have been designated by the board of trustees by proper action.

B.     Outstanding Debts. If an applicant seeking issuance of a liquor license or a current licensee seeking renewal of said license is indebted to the Village for any amount in excess of thirty (30) days, such indebtedness shall be deemed a surcharge of any applicable license fee under this section and the applicant or licensee shall pay off the indebtedness. Failure to pay the surcharge as required shall constitute a basis for denial and/or revocation of a liquor license.

**SECTION II.** Section 5.98.030, Fee, of the Mundelein Municipal Code shall be amended to read as follows:

A.     Annual Fee. There is hereby imposed on the privilege of operating every video gaming terminal in this village, as defined in the Illinois Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/1, et seq., an annual fee of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for each such device. When application for an annual video gaming terminal license is made after the expiration of six months of the current license year, the fee imposed on each video gaming terminal device shall be one-half the annual fee for the remainder of the license year.

B.     Outstanding Debts. If an applicant seeking issuance of a video gaming terminal license or a current licensee seeking renewal of said license is indebted to the Village for any amount in

excess of thirty (30) days, such indebtedness shall be deemed a surcharge of any applicable license fee under this section and the applicant or licensee shall pay off the indebtedness. Failure to pay the surcharge as required shall constitute a basis for denial and/or revocation of a video gaming terminal license.

**SECTION III.** If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

**SECTION IV.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION V.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.




