ORDINANCE NO. O-24-07-37

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 5.76 OF THE MUNDELEIN MUNICIPAL CODE FOR CLASS G LIQUOR LICENSES AUTHORIZED IN THE VILLAGE OF MUNDELEIN AS IT RELATES TO JJSF GRIT, INC. DBA MOMO SUSHI

WHEREAS, the Village of Mundelein, Lake County, Illinois, is a home rule municipality as contemplated under Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and the passage of this Ordinance constitutes an exercise of the Village's home rule powers and functions as granted in the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

WHEREAS, JJSF Grit, Inc. owns and operates Momo Sushi at 662 South Lake Street; and

WHEREAS, the Mundelein Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the best interest of the Village to decrease the number of Class G liquor licenses from six (6) to five (5) due to the owner's decision to no longer sell alcohol.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MUNDELEIN, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF ILLINOIS as follows:

SECTION I. Subsection B of Section 5.76.140, License classification; fees; number; hours; is hereby amended to and shall henceforth read as follows:

G. Class G license, (restaurant, beer and wine sales only), which shall authorize the retail sale in restaurants of beer and wine and no other type of alcoholic liquor, for consumption only at tables or booths on the licensed premises where sold. Consumption of beer or wine at or over a counter or bar is specifically prohibited on premises covered by a Class G license. Such license may be issued and retained by those establishments which:

- (1) Have a seating capacity at tables and booths for a minimum of twenty-five persons for food service;
- (2) Are, in fact, operated and licensed as restaurants, as defined herein;
- (3) Offer their patrons full and complete meals, including a dinner menu, and in which the serving of beer and wine is incidental and complementary to the service of such meals;
- (4) Have no coin-operated amusement machines on the premises; and
- (5) Class G license holders are not permitted to offer banquet services within the licensed facility.

The annual fee for each license shall be one thousand five hundred dollars and there shall be no more than a total of six Class G licenses outstanding and in force at any one time. A licensee which possesses a valid Class G license shall not serve, or offer for sale, beer or wine between the hours of 12:00 AM and 6:00 AM and shall not allow any beer or wine to be present on the tables or booths in the establishment between 1:00 AM and 6:00 AM.

The term "full and complete meals, including a dinner menu" means food service provided by a licensee on the licensed premises on not less than five days each week, between at least the hours of 5:00 PM and 8:00 PM continuously.

Class G license holders are permitted to allow patrons to bring their own wine to be consumed on the premises with their meal as authorized by Section 5.76.350 of this code.

SECTION II. Severability. If any section, paragraph or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION III. Repeal of Prior Ordinances. All prior Ordinances in conflict or inconsistent herewith are hereby expressly repealed only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

SECTION IV. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form, as required by law.
