## **ORDINANCE NO. O-25-06-41**

### **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5.76 OF THE MUNDELEIN MUNICIPAL CODE TO DECREASE THE NUMBER OF CLASS N LIQUOR LICENSES AUTHORIZED IN THE VILLAGE OF MUNDELEIN AS IT RELATES TO LAKESHORE DANCE ACADEMY, INC.**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Mundelein, Lake County, Illinois, is a home rule municipality as contemplated under Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and the passage of this Ordinance constitutes an exercise of the Village's home rule powers and functions as granted in the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the best interests of the Village to decrease the number of authorized Class N liquor licenses from one(1) to zero (0) as the Lakeshore Dance Academy license expired and business will no longer be serving alcohol at the business located at 206 Terrace.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MUNDELEIN, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS**, that:

SECTION I. Subsection N. of Section 5.76.140, License classification; fees; number; hours; is hereby amended to decrease the number of authorized Class N liquor licenses from one (1) to zero (0), and shall henceforth read as follows:

Class N license shall authorize beauty shops, hair salons, nail salons, barbershops and dance studios as defined by the Mundelein Zoning Ordinance, Title 20 of the Municipal Code, to serve beer, wine, and champagne to its patrons as incidental to the patron's purchase of goods or services offered by the licensee. A Class N license shall be subject to the following regulations:

- (1) The licensee may serve patrons of the business with individual servings of beer, wine, or champagne.
- (2) No beer, wine, or champagne may be served to, or consumed by, persons on the business premises except as a complement to the patron's contemporaneous purchase of goods and services made available to the public by the licensee.
- (3) The service and consumption of beer, wine, or champagne at the licensed premises is limited to not more than two twelve-ounce servings of beer or two five-ounce servings of wine or champagne beverages for each patron during any single calendar day.
- (4) No alcoholic beverages other than beer, wine, or champagne are permitted.
- (5) All employees of the licensee serving alcohol must have successfully completed BASSET certification.
- (6) It shall be unlawful for the licensee, its agents, and employees to permit any patron to leave the licensed premises with an open container of beer, wine, or champagne.
- (7) The licensee must maintain insurance coverage as required by [Section] 5.76.040(m) of this chapter.
- (8) A Class N license shall not be issued to any business which operates primarily as a packaged liquor store or restaurant.

The annual fee for each Class N license shall be five hundred dollars. In no case shall the sale or consumption of beer, wine, or champagne take place outside of the licensee's normal business hours of the business and no earlier than nine a.m. and no later than ten p.m. There shall be no more than a total

of zero Class N license outstanding and in force at any one time.

SECTION II. Severability. If any section, paragraph, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION III. Repeal of Prior Ordinances. All prior Ordinances in conflict or inconsistent herewith are hereby expressly repealed only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

SECTION IV. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form, as required by law.
